


I Spy



Brain break

5 minutes



Instructions

Ask the pupils to stand up and take part in their tables. Where one pupils starts and thinks of an object in the room, and says "I spy with my little eye, something beginning with..." where the other pupils continue to look around the room finding objects that begin with that letter. Then, whoever guesses correctly begins the next game

Health & Safety

- Ensure floors are clear of trip hazards before taking part in any activity
- Ensure pupils leave stationary on the table
- Remind pupils of their own spatial awareness
- Give clear instructions.

Teacher Tips

Foundation: Could be things they see, can also give clues to what colour it is

Key Stage 1: Could be things they only see in the classroom

Key Stage 2: Could be prompted by the teacher eg. can't be something on the floor or must be something you'd find outside

The pupils could do this with things they see in the classroom, and can also give clues on what colour it is

- School bag
- Computer
- Posters
- Tables
- Windows

Key Stage 1 Example:

Could also be carried out with things they find in the classroom

- Books
- Rug
- Chairs
- Whiteboard
- Things in a pencil case

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Key Stage 2 Example:

To increase the difficulty, the pupils may have to think of items in the classroom that are not on the floor, or the pupils can become creative and think of items they may find in a supermarket or things they find at the zoo

At the zoo:

- Elephants
- Lion
- Fish
- Trees
- Giraffes

In a supermarket:

- Milk
- Bread
- Cashier
- Freezers
- Fruit and vegetables
