Instructions

Have pupils get into pairs.

Teacher then sets a category (see examples below)

Both pupils then look at each other and think of their answer in their head.

When everyone has thought of their answer, the teacher will then count to 3.

On the count of 3 pupils should stand up and say their answer out loud to their partner.

If both pupils were able to successfully read each other's mind and come up with the same answer then they get a point.

First duo to 3 points wins!

Health & Safety

- Ensure floors are clear of trip hazards before taking part in any activity.
- Ensure pupils leave stationary on the table.
- Remind pupils of their own spatial awareness.
- Give clear instructions.

Teacher Tips

This activity is suited to all ages.

Can also support curriculum work - teachers can choose any relevant topics as categories

Foundation level examples: animals, colour, family

KS1 examples: people who look after us, modes of transport, animals that live in the jungle/desert

KS2 examples: words that rhyme with..., this shape has x amount of sides, teacher can describe a character from a book they are currently reading or a topic they are currently studying
