Instructions

Print off our activity sheet and ask pupils to cut out the sequences or events. Ask them then to stand and work with the person beside them to put the pictures in order of what happens first and complete the sequences.

Health & Safety

- Ensure floors are clear of trip hazards
- Ensure pupils leave stationary on the table.
- Remind pupils of their own spatial awareness.
- Give clear instructions.

Foundation: ask pupils to put their school day and nursery rhymes in the correct sequence

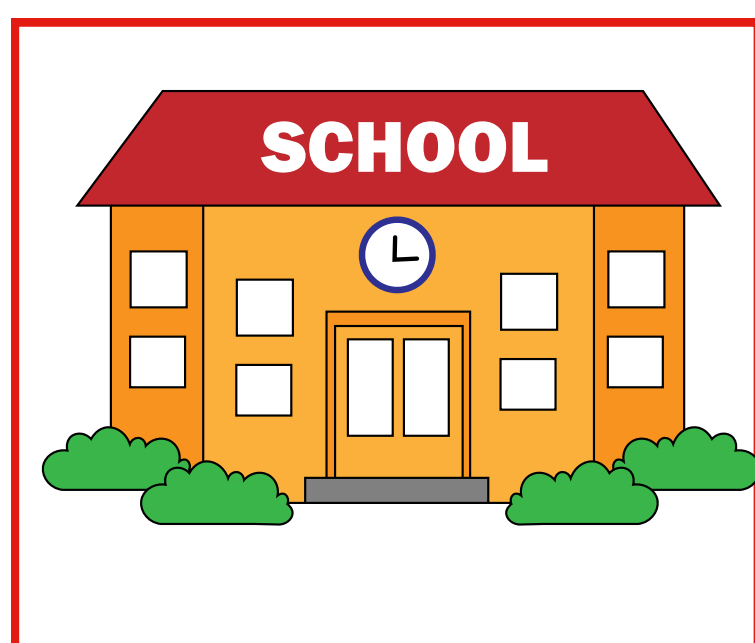
KS1: ask pupils to put the days of the week and seasons in the correct sequence

KS2: ask pupils to put the life cycle of a frog and historical events in the correct sequence.

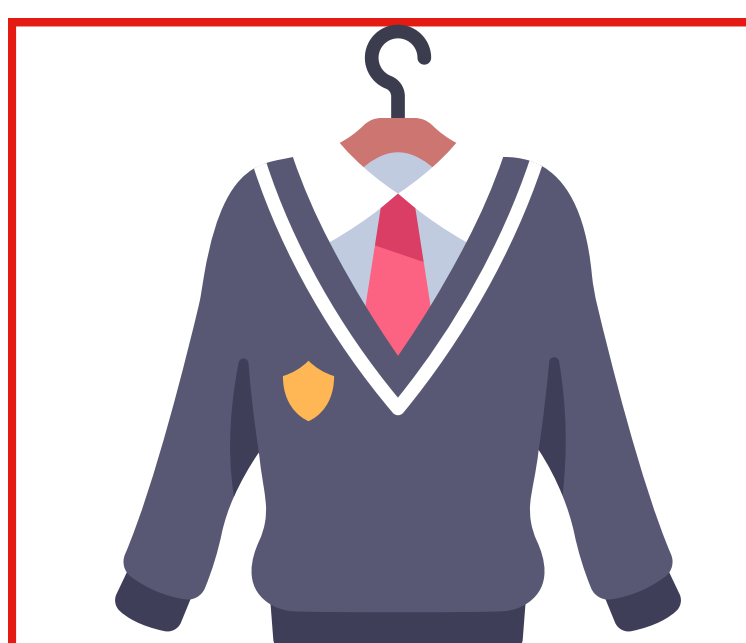
What Comes First?

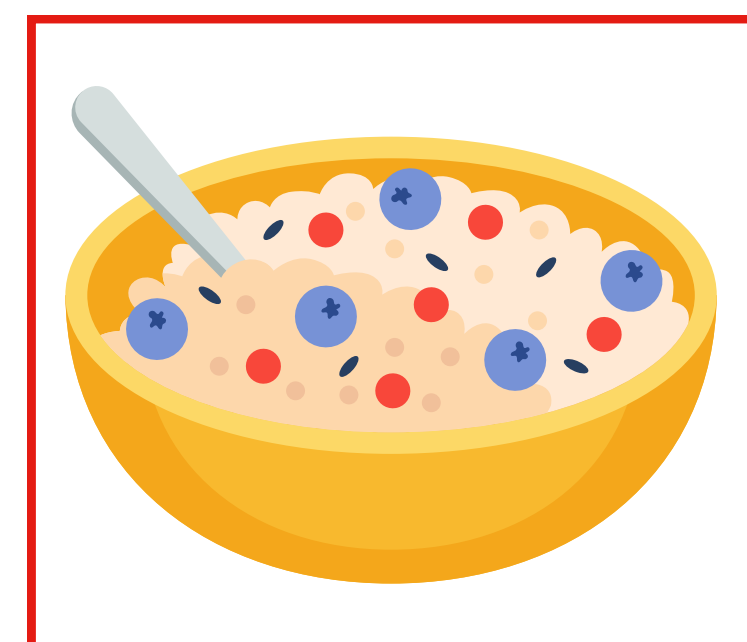

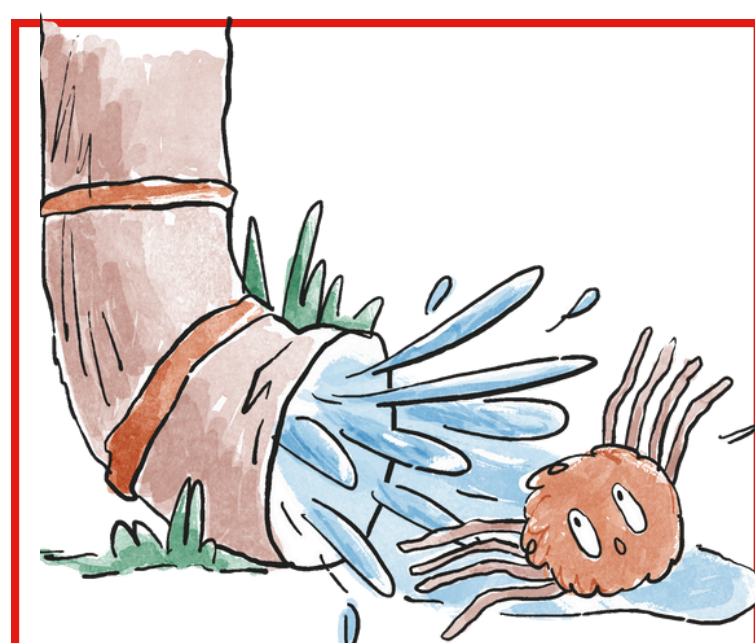

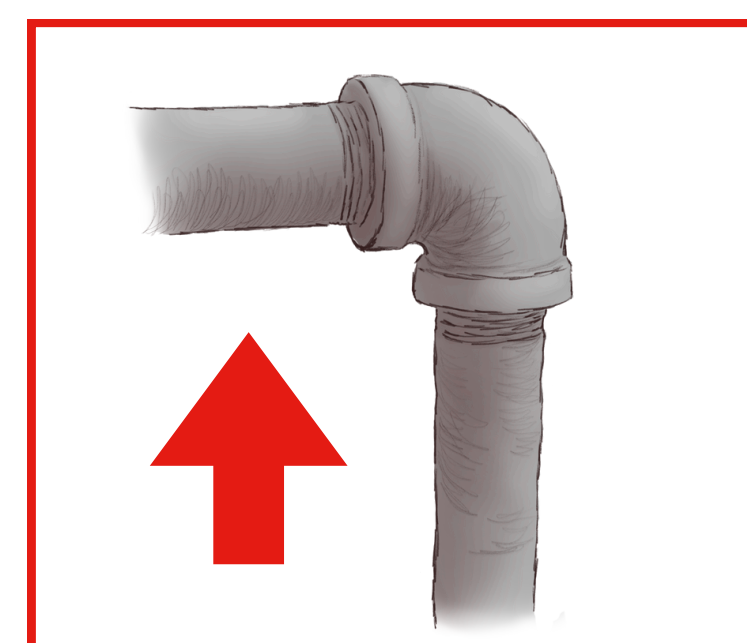
Foundation Example 2: Incy Wincy Spider

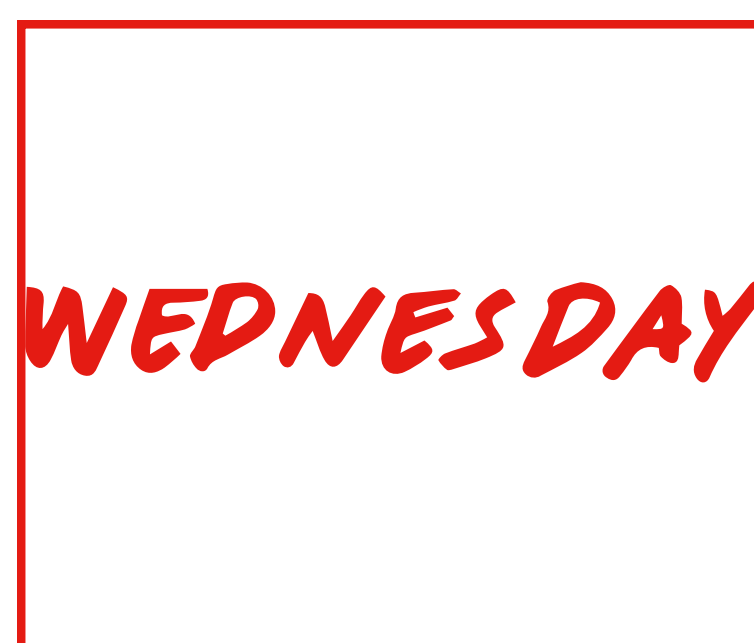

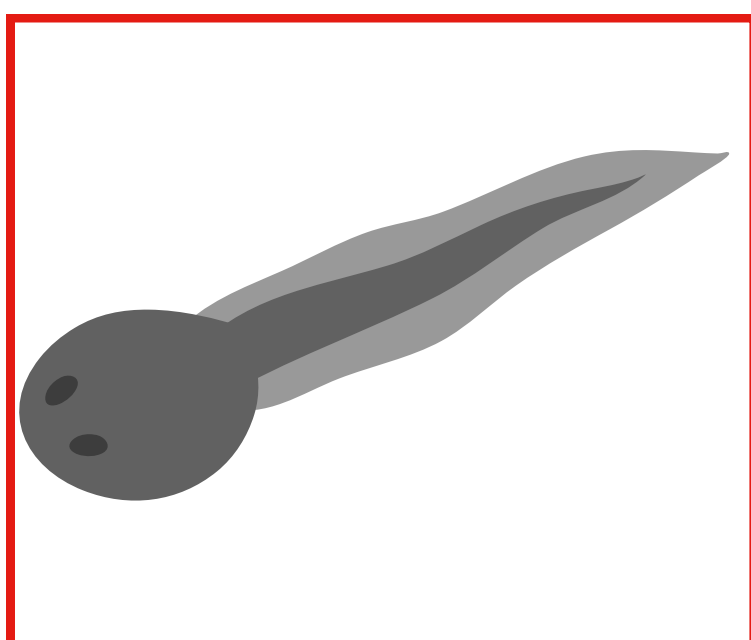

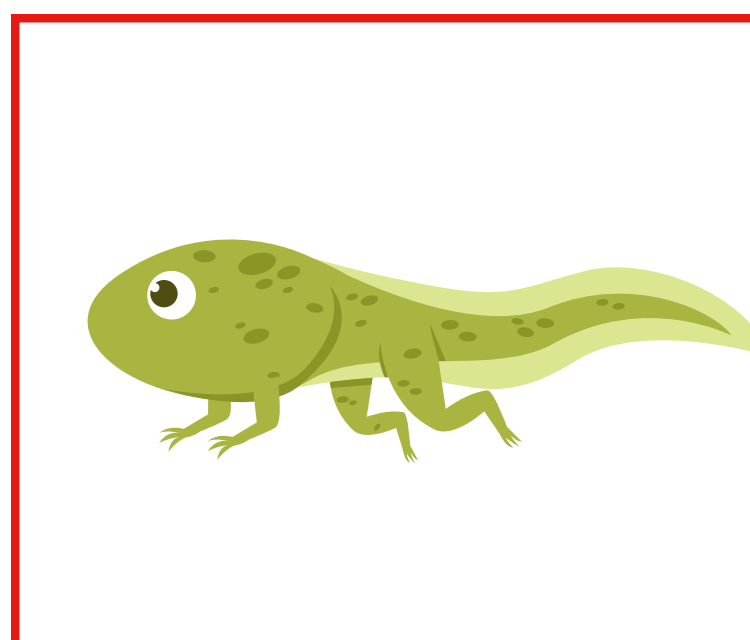

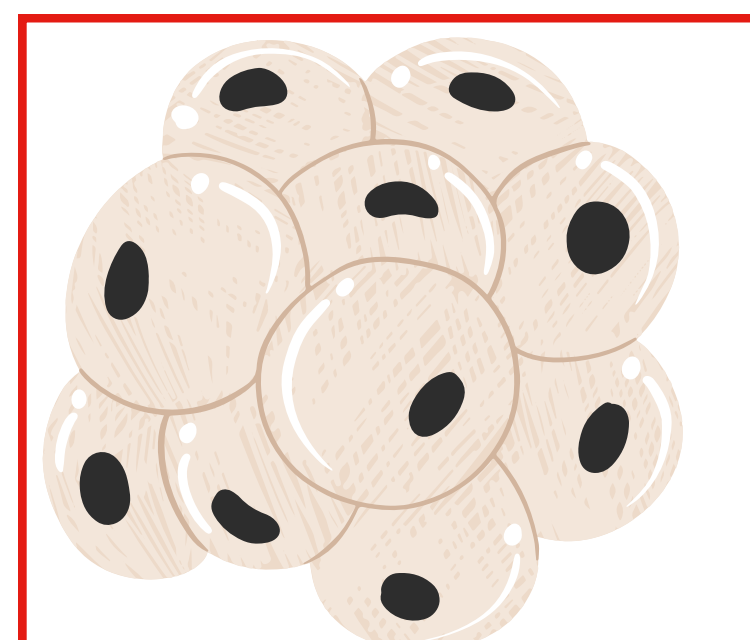

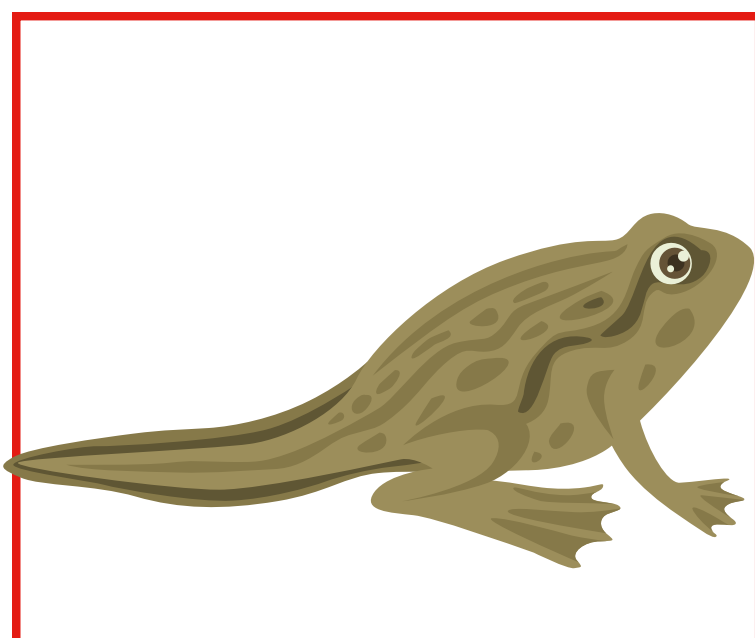
Tadpole



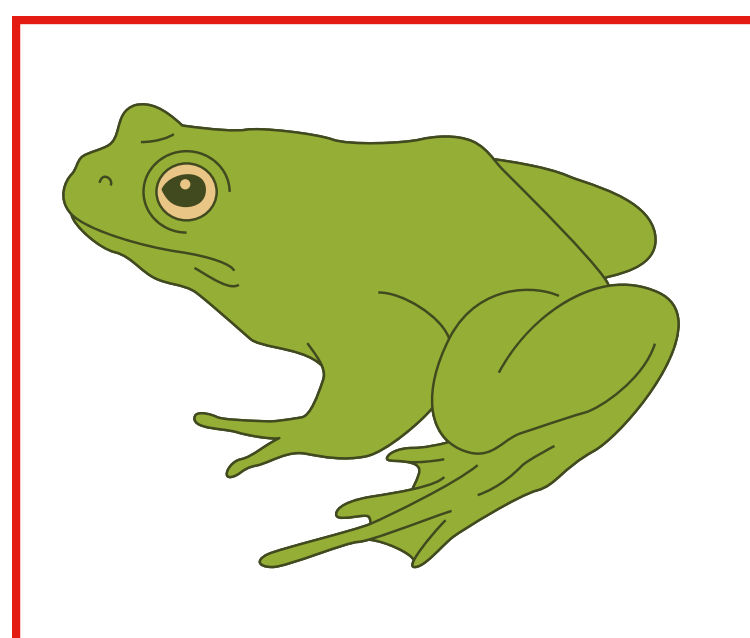
Tadpole with legs
